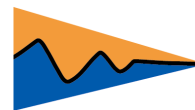

NOTICE OF RACE

REVISED JUNE 2nd 2010

(Revisions in RED)

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. Appendix P will apply as changed by NOR 1.3.
- 1.3. Rules P2.2 and P2.3 will not apply and rule P2.1 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty.
- 1.4. The Preamble to Part 4 and RRS 40 is changed to require Transport Canada approved personal flotation devices (PFDs) to be worn by competitors at all times when afloat, except when changing clothing.

2. ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

3.1 The regatta is open to eligible sailors in the following classes:

Opti Green - born 1995 or later (15 and under), first year of racing

Opti Red: born 1995-1997 (age 13-15)

Opti Blue: born 1998-1999 (age 11-12)

Opti White: born 2000 or later (age 10 and under)

Laser 4.7 – 12-16 years old

Laser Radial – 12 & up

Laser – over 16 years old

29er Class – over 16 years old

International 14 – over 16 years old

Club 420 – 12 & up

* all ages are as at December 31 2010

3.2 Eligible sailors may enter by registering online – hyperlink to registration form will be available on the WSC & CYA websites

3.3. All competitors must present proof of age and CYA membership according to CYA's Application of RRS 75 for Sailor Eligibility – see attachment 1. All competitors must present waivers and medical release forms signed by a parent or legal guardian at the Registration Check-in Desk. The waivers and medical release forms can be downloaded from the Regatta website.

3.4. For competitors that have not reached the age of consent, the parent or guardian of such competitor shall identify in writing a parent or adult representative that shall be responsible for the competitor throughout the event.

4. FEES

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available upon completion of registration at the Wabamun Sailing Club.

6. VENUE

The Wabamun Sailing Club is located 60 km west of Edmonton on Lake Wabamun.

7. THE COURSES

There will be three course areas. Courses will be Windward/Leeward or Trapezoid and will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

8. PENALTY SYSTEM

Rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty for the 29er and International 14 classes.

10. AMENDMENTS

Any amendments to this Notice of Race will be posted here no later than June 14th, 2010.

11. SCORING

Seven races are scheduled of which one race must be completed to constitute a series.

12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

13. RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

14. PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows:

- CYA medals will be awarded to the top three finishers in all classes.
- CYA 15 & Under Western National Sailing Championship Award
- Stephen M. Tupper Trophy – Western Intermediate Championships, Single Handed Winner
- Western Canadian Radial Championship trophy
- Western Canadian Radial female Championship trophy
- 18 & under Laser Championship
- Western Canadian 29er Championship trophy
- Other prizes may be awarded

15. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.

16. SAFETY

All boats are required to have a minimum 5 metre long by 7mm diameter floating line attached to the mast while afloat. Sheets or other rigging may not be substituted for this purpose.

17. RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

In participating in the event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for the said event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

Attachment 1:

Application of RRS 75 to determine Sailor Eligibility at CYA Events and National Sailing Competitions in Canada

The following items are required to show at registration desk check-in to confirm eligibility to race.

1. CYA member card (and valid proof of age for age restricted events); or
2. Proof of membership with a CYA member club or other CYA member organization, or other ISAF member national authority (MNA)*, (and valid proof of age for age restricted events);

A sailor without

- CYA member card, or
- proof of membership with a CYA member club or other CYA member organization, or
- proof of membership with other ISAF member national authority

may obtain a Right-to-Race card which will be available at the registration desk for a fee. A Right-to-Race sailor card is valid only until the completion of the event being entered.

CYA member cards are issued by the Provincial Sailing Associations, who then issue them to CYA member clubs. Directors or managers at the clubs then issue the cards to their members.

Proof of age - the following are valid forms of proof of age:

- Valid passport;
- Provincially issued identification – e.g. drivers' licence, health card;
- Municipally issued photo accreditation that includes full name and birth date;
- School- issued photo accreditation that includes full name and birth date.

Proof of membership with a CYA member club or other organization – the following are acceptable means to prove membership or affiliation:

- Membership card from CYA member club or other organization (or other ISAF MNA) – such card indicating name and type of membership held;
- Official and original signed document (or copy – facsimile or electronic file) from director of the CYA member club or other CYA member organization – such document is to be on letterhead of the club or organization, and need name the competitors and indicate the nature of the membership or affiliation with that organization;
- On-site reference to member list on official website of the organization – such list will indicate full name and nature of the membership or affiliation.

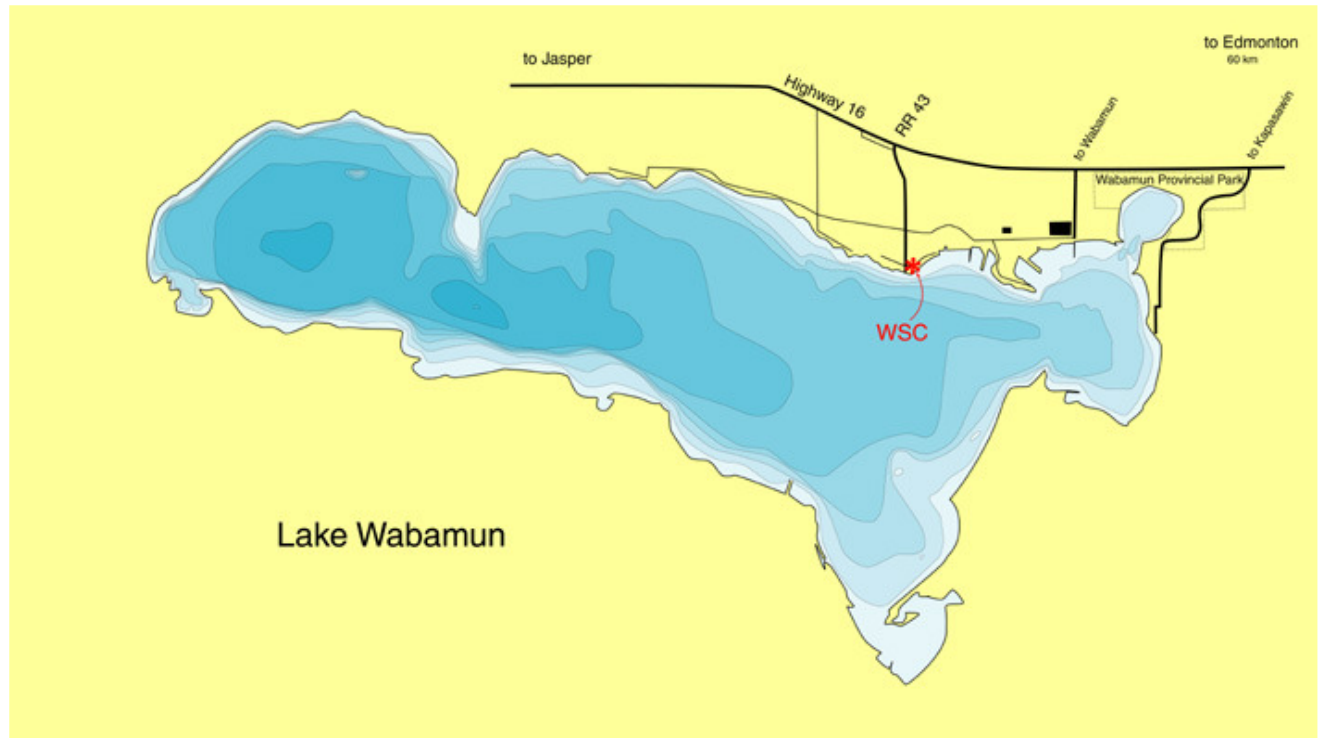
